We mourn for the families of Uvalde, TX. "Oh God, heal our land. Be merciful to us. Comfort the loved ones of those who died in this horrific attack. Help us find ways to protect our children especially."



Romans 1 spoke of the evil in the people of Rome as it was declining: "They did not think it worthwhile to retain the knowledge of God..." We've done the same. America's leaders, along with many Americans, have taken us down this path, where we chose to not "retain the knowledge of

God" we had here for centuries. Government, media and universities were complicit in removing any thought of Him as our Creator and Judge.

"So, God gave them over to a depraved mind, so that they do what ought not to be done." That means God allowed people's free will to take its course. As they moved further away from God their minds went further into darkness. That's happened here too. "They have become filled with every kind of wickedness, evil, greed and depravity. They are full of envy, murder, strife, deceit and malice." We are seeing these exact same things play out now. God's Word is true.

Certainly fewer guns would help. No one who has made threats against others, or has mental health issues, should ever be allowed to purchase guns. I see no reason why assault weapons should be sold to the public. But the problems playing out here are not about guns. Don't believe that lie.

This is a spiritual problem. America's leaders have led us as a nation into a wide-spread rejection of God, His truth, and His ways. Without Him our evil natures are taking over, and the violence, hatred, and depression we're increasingly seeing is the result. The hopelessness among the young is heartbreaking. We see it in the deaths from drug overdoses, which outnumber murders by a factor of 5 to 1.

Things will not get better until Americans repent and turn back to God, and acknowledge Him as Creator and Lord. But these same leaders will never lead us in repenting. They disavow the existence of God and the Spirit world, so how could they possibly heal us spiritually? They are godless and arrogant. They will not acknowledge the harm they have caused, and are diverting attention from their own sin and failing, and the spiritual rot that exists in our land, by focusing on guns.

We as the Church, as God's people, can help by doing what the Bible says: "If My people, called by My name, will humble themselves, and pray, and seek My face, and turn from their sins, I will hear, I will forgive, and I will heal their land."

We as Christians need to get ourselves right with God. We've all fallen into "the ways of the world" to some extent and need to examine ourselves. Then we can cry out to God and expect His help. Only by doing that can we oppose the great evil in our land. Only then will we be able to take on the struggle against godlessness and wickedness, and the totalitarianism we are headed toward here.


