Since we in America today have the highest standard of living, and more "things" to use and enjoy, than any people in earth's history, its surprising so many are either angry or depressed much of the time.

Those who are angry watch for things "the other side" does that show how corrupt "they" are. For those on the Left these things are more evidence of a right-wing conspiracy; for those on the Right they're evidence woke-ness is taking over.

Those who are depressed talk about how broken our institutions are, how low the birth rate is, or the continuing opioid crisis. As a writer in <u>First Things</u> put it - "rage and despair, the two dominant flavors".

There's a 2nd century Jewish legend about 2 rabbis walking through Jerusalem after it was destroyed by the Romans. They saw wild animals running in the spot where the Temple's Holy of Holies had been. One of them laughed. The other said, "How can you laugh when what was once the earthly home of God is now rubble?" The first one pointed out that God's promises to rebuild the city and make it a place where people lived again in joy and peace could not be fulfilled until it had been destroyed. He saw the destruction as the first phase of new life, and so he rejoiced even sadness.

Until things break down they can't be rebuilt into something better. We see this in nature where the ground must be torn up for anything to grow. Look at it right after its plowed and it looks awful. But it's necessary for future seeds to sprout there. That can only happen in places that are torn. To watch anything break down is to be closer to a new beginning.

Who knows where America is going? It's possible things fall apart in the short-term but grow back and flourish long-term. In fact when Jesus predicted Jerusalem's fall He told His friends, "When all these things begin to take place, stand and look up, for your redemption is coming nearer." (Luke 21).



For those of us who trust that a just and loving God is in control of history, **hope in Him** is what should characterize our lives. "His mercies are new every morning." Can we experience that, and show it in our conversation with others? "He gives us beauty for ashes, joy in place of mourning." Trust in His promises.

From the Pastor: I attended a luncheon this week put on by CornerstoneNH to celebrate all the "right to life" pregnancy counseling centers in NH that worked so hard for decades to protect the lives of the unborn, and provided support for women who chose to have their baby. Two ministries we give to, BirthRight on Crystal Ave. and RealOptions, were honored by the crowd of 200 people. I sat next to 2 women from BirthRight who have each worked there, unpaid, for 37 years! One of the worship leaders, an ABC pastor from Milford, spoke of his own Mom walking into an abortion clinic 40 yrs ago and said he was only alive today because a woman (and they were mostly women) like one of those honored spoke to her and urged her to "choose life". CornerstoneNH did a lot of the work to get the bill banning late-term abortions in NH passed this year.

Calvary Bible Church on Hampstead Rd is holding its annual Missions Conference this weekend. They're hosting missionaries working in Albania, Brazil, Puerto Rico, the Arab world, and Cuba.


### Opportunities to Serve, Fellowship & Connect:
