Welcome to the New Year - 2023. We pray it will be a year of growing closer to the God Who made us and loves us with an everlasting love, as well as a time of peace, joy and prosperity.

We've seen several of our people face serious health threats this winter and the death of loved ones, along with other family concerns. Praise God we've seen healings, successful surgeries and stays in rehab during that time. But they are challenging.

On top of that there are events across our nation and the world that cause us anxiety. Yet what we are experiencing, as hard and painful as it may be, is little in comparison to what the billions of poor and destitute across the earth are experiencing. Or other Christians facing persecution. Read up on what is happening to Christians and churches in Nigeria, Afghanistan, and elsewhere. It's frightening.

And the first Christians, on a societal level, faced far more terrifying times than we have had to endure. The apostle Paul wrote of facing death all day long, like sheep headed to the slaughterhouse; of "trouble, hardship, persecution, famine, danger and violence". (Romans 8) This is NOT to minimize what you are going through; we feel for you. But seeing them face these things successfully should be a source of hope for us.

Paul also wrote these words of assurance, inspired by the Holy Spirit - "Who or what can separate us from the love of God seen in Christ Jesus?" And his answer was clear: "Nothing. Nothing can separate us from that love." Great news! So our futures are secure. "Yet", he added, "amid all these things we are more than conquerors through Him Who has loved us." Romans 8:37

On this earth we will never live in a utopia without these difficulties. We will always live "amid" them. Jesus Himself confirmed, "In this world you will have tribulation." But He gave us the same good news. "Be of good cheer. I have overcome the world."

Our Great God has promised those who are "in Christ" will win out over all problems and difficulties, even over death. And we can do more than survive or get through what we're facing. We can conquer them in some sense - as individuals facing our own troubles, and as a church facing what our culture throws at us. There are types of challenges we can push back against and conquer.

Let's pray for a growing faith in each of us that will let us rest in this truth in the New Year.

Psalm 40:3-4 says "He put a new song in my mouth, a hymn of praise to our God...."

Speaking about His death, in Luke 22:20, we are told Jesus "took the cup saying 'This cup is the new covenant in My blood, which is poured out for vou.' "


