We've had 2 encounters with people experiencing homelessness in the last 4 months. They came to us for help because State and Town government often can't do much for them. One 67 yr old man knocked on our door during our New Years Eve service. We 1. found him a safe place to stay that night (the office porch). 2. helped him get a housing voucher



enabling him to afford an apartment (which took a few months vs. the normal several years because of his advanced age); 3. found him a bed at the Nashua Rescue Mission until the Center for Life Management found him an apartment.

This past Sunday night a 46 yr old looking for work was seen in the parking lot with all his belongings - 2 suit cases, 10 bags. A tenant notified our property manager Tim who offered him our porch for the night. Several people spent time with him Monday verifying he was a good person to help.

He had a background in manufacturing, and found an interview in Somersworth, NH on Tuesday. We took him there and he was offered the job which he will start Monday. We brought him back to that area on Wednesday to be drug tested, and got him situated at a motel for a week. But we had to pay the \$500 weekly charge. He's searching for something less expensive. He has no car so he's also looking for a bike to get to the job. Pray for him please. His name is Orion.

I'm proud and grateful that we had the resources to help both. But it brings up some issues. The number of homeless and people begging for money is growing. Our location makes it likely more people will approach us. There is no emergency housing in Derry, nor are there inexpensive housing options.

In the Bible after Cain killed Abel, God confronted him and asked him where his brother was. Cain answered, "Am I my brother's keeper?" That's a fundamental question for society - "Are we responsible for others, and how much do we owe them?" Jesus told us to love our neighbor as we love ourselves and our own families, and to especially care for those who are "the least" in our world's eyes. That's a good starting point.

We had almost 90 people at worship last Sunday! That's back near where we were pre-Covid. Having a group of teens with us has been great. It certainly brings down our median age! LOL It shows God is working among the young, maybe in answer to our prayers. It is so important that we interact with all the visitors God sends our way, and welcome new people. Just to say, "Hello how are you?" or "It's nice to see you, have a good day" is very helpful.

When it was being designed, we gathered all the staff & even some children to place pieces in a pre-designed outline. Each piece by itself looked broken and useless. But all of them put together in a design made it something beautiful. It reminds me of how God has us in his pre-designed plan.

At times, WE may think we are broken & cannot possibly be used in God's plan or purpose for us. Maybe because of something we have done or maybe something that was done to us, or even because we've had too few or too many birthdays.

Is There Evidence for the Resurrection of Jesus?

Jesus' historical resurrection from the dead is the "smoking gun" that cements the truth of Biblical Christianity. If Jesus actually supernaturally rose from the dead, then we can know with absolute certainty that the following are true:

God exists

There is an afterlife (Heaven and Hell) Jesus is God What Jesus says is True The Bible is True (because Jesus said so) Sin is our biggest problem

Jesus is the only solution

Not only does the resurrection positively prove those things, but the reverse is true as well. If Jesus has not actually historically risen from the dead, then Christianity is a sham.

The Bible says it this way: And if Christ has not been raised, then your faith is useless and you are still guilty of your sins. In that case, all who have died believing in Christ are lost! And if our hope in Christ is only for this life, we are more to be pitied than anyone in the world (<u>1 Corinthians 15:17-19</u>).

Clearly Jesus' Resurrection is not merely an important issue to consider, but THE MOST IM-PORTANT issue. If Jesus raised, we must all Repent and Believe. If he didn't, then those who do believe should be pitied.

The Resurrection has lead many skeptics and Atheists to come to faith. It is worth studying. Many world-renown Scholars have written books and volumes and articles and essays on the Resurrection. I see no reason to rein-

vent the wheel when others have done such an exhaustive job. One of my favorite resources on the Resurrection is Josh McDowell's short essay, *Evidence for the Resurrection*. There is compelling evidence for God. But knowing in your head about God is not enough. We must humbly turn to him. That's repentance, and our pride is what keeps so many people from coming to Jesus for salvation, not lack of evidence. God has made his existence clear to us through the creation and our conscience. Also the Resurrection.

[Everybody knows] the truth about God because he has made it obvious to them. For ever since the world was created, people have seen the earth and sky. Through everything God made, they can clearly see his invisible qualities—his eternal power and divine nature. So they have no excuse for not knowing God (Romans 1:19-20).

I speak to people about Jesus all the time. Often, after answering questions with evidence, I'll ask them, "If I could answer every single objection you have to faith in Christ, and you knew that Jesus is who he says he is, would you worship him?" And you know what, nearly 100% of the time, the person thinks about it and answers, "No, I wouldn't worship him." And that's the issue right there. It's not lack of evidence, because God has kindly given us overwhelming evidence. It's just that **as humans we want to do what we want to do, and we don't like the idea of anybody, even our Creator, telling us what to do**.

The Bible says it this way

Yes, [everybody knows] God, but they wouldn't worship him as God or even give him thanks. And they began to think up foolish ideas of what God was like. As a result, their minds became dark and confused (<u>Romans 1:21</u>). Please don't let your pride keep you from the GREATEST GIFT ever. There's plenty of evidence for Jesus. But pride stops us from

turning to him.

Will you please turn away from your pride and turn to Jesus? Jesus said, "unless you are born again, you cannot see the Kingdom of God" (John 3:3). We are born with a disposition against God, and we need a new way of thinking. We need to be adopted into God's family.


