

From Lastor's Desk

take a minute and settle ourselves. Get rid of the cares of the day. Think about what we're doing: coming before the God who created everything that exists to speak to Him as our Father. We should remind ourselves of what a privilege that is. If we have done sinful things since our last prayer time, which we haven't confessed yet, we want to confess them. If God doesn't show you anything move on. If He does, ask for forgiveness - and believe you have been forgiven, because that is one of God's promises we can rely on: "If we confess our sins He is faithful and will forgive us our sins."

We aren't speaking to God primarily in order to get things. We pray to draw closer to Him. Yet there are things we need, sometimes really important things, and He knows that. As a Church body we have several people right now who are dealing with very serious illnesses. The Lord wants to hear about those things. He will enter into our pain and suffering and walk with us in a way I can't put into words, but know to be real. Part of the reason Jesus went to the Cross was to experientially know our suffering as men and women. That's a beautiful thought. We want to thank Him for that, as well as share our fear or grief. God is faithful, He never changes or lies, and what He's said in His Word He will do. Part of having faith is believing that. He wants us to see Him as trustworthy and is honored when we trust Him. So as we pray we want to keep His promises to us in mind, and ask Him to be faithful to all He has promised. Some of those key promises are:

Romans 8:32 Since He did not spare even His own Son for us but gave Him up for us all, won't He also surely give us everything else?

1 Peter 5:7 Cast all your anxiety on Him because He cares for you.

1 Corinthians 10:13 God is faithful; He will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear. But when you are tempted, he will also provide a way out

Psalm 103:17 From everlasting to everlasting the Lord's love is with those who fear Him.

Nahum 1:7 The Lord is good, a refuge in times of trouble. He cares for those who trust in Him.

Philippians 1:6 He who began a good work in you will be faithful to complete it.

Matthew 6:31233 So do not worry or say, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' For the rest of the world runs after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them. But seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.

Deuteronomy 31:8 The LORD Himself goes before you and will be with you. He will never leave you nor forsake you. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged.

Romans 8:38 Nothing can ever separate us from His love. Death can't, and life can't. The angels won't, and all the powers of hell itself cannot keep God's love away.

There are MANY more of these same kinds of promises. The Psalms and Prophetic books are full of them. Memorize the short ones. Repeat them to yourselves. If our problems are severe we will be very conscious of them almost all the time so we will need to repeat these often. Don't feel bad about that. Knowing them and using them in prayer is super beneficial. Because they are the Words of God Himself there's power in them.

As a Church we should be very proud of our Creative Fellowship Craft Group. These ladies made and delivered over 100 Valentines cards for the residents at Pleasant Valley.

Our denomination, the American Baptist Churches of Vermont and New Hampshire, has called a new Executive Minister to lead our 140 churches, both administratively and spiritually - Jay Noll. Jay will be the point person for finding pastors for churches with vacancies, dealing with crises that arise in churches, organizing events and seminars across the region, and ensuring our financial viability. Jay will be introduced at our Annual Gathering on April 11, 12 and we plan to have several of our leaders there to meet him. Please pray for him and for the many small ABC churches in our region.

On that same note we want to recognize Tim and Margaret Isbell for serving one of these small ABC churches, the United Church in Danbury, NH. Tim has preached there 3 of 4 Sundays a month for the past 3.5 years. They've helped that congregation achieve not just stability but growth during that time.

Recently the Trustees approved renting the 3rd floor office at 4 Crystal Ave (the church office building) to the Lafferty Learning tutoring service. This is the space the Soup Kitchen used to use as an office but it has been vacant for over 5 years.

Our FBCC Food Pantry had a super successful Pantry Plunge in December, raising over \$30,000. Recently the Pantry also received a \$3,000 grant from the Bishops Charitable Assistance Fund in Manchester.

Deacons

Oversee worship and spiritual growth of the church

Trustees

Maintenance of church properties and financial oversight

Christian Ed

Sunday School, Children's Church, Bible Studies

Outreach

Provide opportunities to connect within the church and in the community – dinners, community events, etc.

Missions Committee

Invites missionary speakers and decides on expenditure of missions funds.

Thank you all for providing this special place to worship in! May our Lord bless you all richly for your fellowship."

WELCOME

We've been blessed with several visitors in 2025. We want them all to feel welcome. Here are some tips on how to do that. These were created by our own church 20 yrs ago.

Six Steps Towards a Friendly First Baptist Church

1. Please park towards the back and sit towards the front.

We naturally tend to park towards the front and sit towards the back. Yet for the convenience of newcomers, we want to encourage you to leave the parking spaces nearest the church building open, but please sit towards the front.

2. Make a regular habit of meeting someone you do not know.

The only way that we can insure newcomers feel welcome is if each of us takes the initative to meet people. Often we are hesitant to greet people because we are unsure if they are new to the church. Please do not let that stop you. Introduce yourself and then ask questions to get to know them.

3. If you forget someone's name, don't be hesitant to ask them.

One of the stumbling blocks that keep us from building relationships is that we think that people will be offended because we have forgotten their names. Yet we all know how easily it is to forget people's names—even two minutes after they have introduced themselves! If you see some people you have met before, but have forgotten their name, don't be afraid to say, "I'm sorry, but I forgot your name." It is far better to have people think that you are friendly and have a poor memory than for people to think you have a great memory but are simply unfriendly!

4. Offer to help newcomers find their way.

Though we are familiar with our building, newcomers are not. If you see someone who looks lost, take the initiative to offer assistance.

5. After the service, invite newcomers to coffee time in fellowship hall.

After the service, we have a time of fellowship downstairs. Invite them to come for coffee, and then take some time to talk with them.

6. Would you be willing to invite a newcomer to some event in our church's life?

When people attend a church, what are they looking for more than anything are friends. It means so much to people when someone takes the time to get to know them. Our church offers many events to give you the opportunity to reach out to others.

We need your help! Incorporating new people into the life of the church is a big task—far bigger than our pastor or boards can do alone. If each of us

takes the time to do little things such as meeting people, the corporate effect will be far reaching. We hope that these 6 suggestions will help us make First Baptist Church a friendly Church.
